#### Best Practice - I

- 1. Title of the practice: Compilation of Paper Cuttings
- **2.** Objectives:
  - i. To enhance students' understanding of economic terms.
  - ii. To inculcate the habit of reading newspapers.
  - iii. To develop the critical insight of the students regarding applied economics.
- 3. The Context: It has been observed that the students are mugging up the notes and studying a subject like economics only from exam oriented point of view. Consequently, they fail to realise the relevance of the economic terms that they are studying in the day-today life. Hence, the necessity of this kind of practice.
- 4. The practice: This activity was conducted by the department of Economics. At first, the students were informed about the concept of paper cutting activity. The students who have opted optional/special economics were asked to read the news related to economics from the newspapers. They were asked to bring the paper cuttings which were directly related to the syllabus. After sorting out the cuttings, students were asked to read these cuttings in the classroom. It was followed by discussions by the teacher and the students.
- 5. Evidence of success: It has been observed that students understood the economic concepts and their application in day-today life in a better way.
- 6. Problem encountered: Being located in a rural area, there is limitation to collect the cuttings from various newspapers. The availability of newspapers is limited.

#### **Best Practice - II**

1. Title of the practice: Study Tour

## 2. Objectives:

- To enhance students' interest in the subject like Psychology
- To make students aware about the concept of the Psychology Dept.
- To make students aware about the concept of the psychological experiments.

#### 3. The context:

There is no special subject of Psychology in the college at B.A. Part III level. So there is no Psychology Lab in the college. The Part I and Part II students are unaware about the concept of the Psychology Lab. Hence it becomes necessary to show them the Psychology Lab. Hence the necessity of the activity.

#### 4. The practice:

The department of Psychology conducted this activity. The students who have opted Psychology at Part I and Part II were taken to the Bhogavati Mahavidyalaya, Kurukali. This college offers Psychology as a special subject and has a Psychology Lab. The concerned teachers explained the nature of the Psychology Lab and the psychological concepts. The students were also told about the career opportunities in the field of Psychology after graduation.
